

Reflections on Readings for the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

### "My Kingdom Does Not Belong To This World"

Next Sunday begins the season of Advent, which will help us prepare our hearts to receive our Lord and King at His birth. Our Church now turns our attention to a foremost reality of our



faith - that Jesus is the Christ, the anointed Son of God. He is Lord of the universe but He is also Lord of our hearts, our minds, our lives, and our families.

In our first reading (Daniel 7:13-14), Daniel tells of a vision seeing a divine, heavenly being and yet human in appearance ("one like a Son of man coming on the clouds of heaven"). Even Old Testament writers interpreted this as the messianic figure. Jesus is often quoted in the Gospels as referring to Himself as "Son of Man". Often, when He used this term, many believe He was talking about the end times. Many scholars believe that when He used this term, He had in mind this passage from Daniel, chapter 7.

In our Epistle reading from the Book of Revelation (RV 1:5-8), St. John wrote of the end times, the apocalypse, when he wrote, "he is coming amid the clouds", and that he has made us into "priests for his God and Father." As priests, we are called to teach, to witness, and to love, as our model Christ did for us.


In our Gospel reading (John 18:33–37), we hear a scene from the passion narrative of the Gospel of St. John, as Jesus was interrogated by Pilate. Jesus answered, "My kingdom does not belong to this world." Jesus is not like any king the world would know. He is a servant king, one who reigns in love, not in violence, one who seeks the lost and rescues them.

On this Feast of Christ the King, we are reminded that Jesus is King of heaven and earth and His kingdom is eternal. Because of this, we are called to invite Jesus to reign as Lord and King of our hearts, our families, our avocations, our professions, our hopes and dreams – every aspect of our lives. To do less is to make Jesus a part-time king (with a small k). Jesus invites us to make Him the center of our lives.

### Blessed Marie-Clementine Feast Day: December 1

Blessed Marie-Clémentine Anuarite Nengapeta was born in 1939 in the Democratic Republic of Congo and was martyred in 1964 at the age of 24. She was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1985 and was the first Bantu Catholic blessed.

Anuarite Nengapeta was baptized in 1945 and educated by the first mission in her region. She ran away from home to join the convent of the Sisters of the Holy Family in 1959, taking the name Sister Marie-Clémentine. She served the community as a cook and sacristan, and she was dedicated to teaching.

Civil war broke out in Congo in 1964, and the convent was attacked by rebels. Sister Marie–Clémentine was killed by Col. Pierre Olombe after warding off his attempts to assault her. As she lay dying, she said to her killer: "I forgive you for you do not know what you do." Her parents also forgave her killer; during her beatification Mass, Pope John Paul II said, "And I myself, in the name of the whole church, I forgive with all my heart." It was reported that Pierre Olombe was among the crowd at that Mass. Blessed Marie–Clémentine Anuarite




